

Primary school PE and sport funding September 2017 to April 2018

In April 2013, the government announced new funding for physical education (PE) and sport for schools to improve the quality and breadth of the provision for all pupils aged 5–11, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

The government believes that head teachers and school leaders should decide how best to use this additional funding. They are held accountable for the decisions they make through:

- the sports provision information made available to parents via the school website;
- the Ofsted inspection framework, under which inspectors focus on the impact of the funding on all pupils; and
- the achievement of pupils in PE and sport, through observations and monitoring of lessons and extra-curricular sports clubs.

To date we have allocated money to the following:

- Local sport network service/service level agreement (SLA), provided by our feeder secondary school, to provide professional development, curriculum sessions, access to centrally organised sporting competitions with other schools and to offer out-of-school sporting opportunities both on and off site, giving access to high-quality facilities.
- Specialist resources to broaden the sporting opportunities available to our pupils in school.
- Specialist training for staff.
- Provision of additional and specialist sporting activities in curriculum time.
- Transportation to and from sporting events
- Offsetting the costs of a residential trip for Year 5 and 6 pupils
- Cementing of netball posts into the playground

As of April 2017 to August 2017 we have received £3383 of which £2000 has been spent.

Please see below how we plan to use these funds.

- Competitions - £500 (Richmond)
- Curriculum teaching (gymnastics, dance and fitness) - £2000 Richmond
- After school clubs
- Transportation - £500
